



Volunteer Position: Training and Education Committee Member

Expectations and skills:

Members of the HKSR&R training and education committee are directly responsible for the development and maintenance of organizations operations, policies and procedures. Duties include drafting and proposing waivers and forms needed for the Board of Directors (BOD) and/or other committees, marketing and re-homing of horses in the program ready to be re-homed, and identifying, locating and recommending eligible horses to the BOD to enter the program. Other responsibilities include developing an education plan and executing an equine educational series for multi level community attendants.

Members are also expected to be able and willing to attend educational events and support the organization through their time, effort, networking connections and skills. Members may also be called upon to assist with various fund raising activities including solicitation of goods and services and volunteer hours at scheduled events.

It is the expectation of the HKSR&R BOD that the training committee will oversee the daily activities of HKSR&R approved trainers, will assist in maintaining a pool of eligible trainers, oversee realistic and regular training schedules, and assist in the upkeep of the Rendaiyu horse management system as requested by the committee chair(s). Additionally the committee should ensure a minimum of 1 educational opportunity to be offered every 2 months and develop a plan for further involvement of youth members and volunteers.

Committee members should have a strong work ethic and be dependable, self-motivated and reliable. Members should also enjoy working in and around the public and having a fun time. The Training and Education committee has little to no functional direct contact with our horses although it should be noted that events may be conducted with or around horses. Members of the Training and Education committee do not need any horseback riding or horse handling experience however previous knowledge will be an asset to the committee.

It is not necessary to have any previous committee service experience just a willingness to learn.
