HKS&R strongly believes that education will prevent negligence and decrease the need for rescue. We want to change the lives and welfare of horses through education and rehabilitation.

Our goals:

- Rehabilitate and retrain horses so they can find their place and job in the equestrian world;
- Supply after care and training services to those who adopt from the Rescue Center in order to decrease the likelihood that they will return to a rescue state or center;
- Build an Education Center not affiliated with any one organization in order to increase the availability of education;
- Provide education to the general public at an accessible Education Center;
- Make available education and opportunities to learn about horse management to the middle and high school students, especially students that may not be privileged enough to have vast opportunities.
